- GP Appointment Clinics in Community Clinics throughout Malta
- Some secondary care services such as MCC and Orthopaedic Clinic





- 24/7 Telemedicine service through specialized centre with specially trained GPs.
- Nursing and Midwifery services including National Immunization, treatment room services and many other services)

Who is the GP?

- General Practice as a recognized specialty
- 3-4 years of training including rotations in various hospital departments to gain requisite experience and knowledge (training accredited by both MCFD and RCGP)
- Special training in communication skills and dealing with the bio-psycho-social aspect of patient care
- Continuous Medical Education
- Access to Primary HealthCare facilities opportunity to refer when needed (to A&E or to Outpatients Department)



Who is the GP?

- First port of call for medical issues
- Common ailments, other medical and surgical interventions.
- First aid and basic life support in emergency situations.
- Health Promotion advice and primary prevention.
- Home visits if circumstances permit.
- Investigations (blood tests, urine tests, X-Rays, ECG) as considered necessary by the doctor.
- Referral to a secondary care if necessary.



Health Centres (I)

- GPs are available in the 9 Health Centres in Malta around the clock
- Paola, Floriana & Mosta are open 24/7 whilst other Health Centres have different opening hours
- A fully equipped treatment room in every Health Centre is available for any procedures required





Health Centres (II)

- Health Centre GP service works on a walk-in clinic basis (first come first served) where appointments are not needed
- On average 100-250 GP cases per day per Health Centre
- More urgent cases are seen to in the treatment room (75-100 pts/day)
- Home Visits are offered in cases of emergencies, bedbound patients,
 the frail and severely disabled these are usually vetted by the doctors at Telemedicine and passed on to the respective Centre



GP Appointment Clinics (I)

- Community Clinics are an easily accessible way of seeing a GP
- These work through appointment and require little to no waiting time
- Appointments are 20 minutes long in a more community-oriented environment allowing enough time for good holistic care



GP Appointment Clinics (II)

- Community Clinics allow for improved continuity of care whilst avoiding unnecessary waiting time
- Also include specialized services such as the Long Covid Clinic

Telemedicine (I)

- A 24/7 service manned by qualified and trained GPs
- Allows for tele-consultations including video consultations using Microsoft Teams or even Whatsapp
- Doctors are trained to conduct a consultation over the phone or video and manage common ailments without the need for patients to be seen in person – electronic prescriptions sent through email or direct contact with a pharmacist





Telemedicine (I)

- In some cases, the GP may agree with the patient that it would be ideal to be seen in person, in which case either an appointment at a Community Clinic is set, or the patient is directed towards the nearest Health Centre
- GPs may liaise with other HCPs to set up appointments as needed





Electronic Patient Records IT System

- The EPR was introduced to facilitate continuity of care
- Whichever clinic you choose to go to, the GP will be able to access your medical history which allows for better management
- Not only used by GPs within Health Centres but also by Nurses and Allied Health Professionals allowing for more accurate medical data
- Accessible by doctors at Telemedicine and Community Clinics as well
- GPs also have access to other necessary systems such as iSoft (for lab investigations), PACS (for imaging) and the POYC system (for medication)
